The purpose of the three-day meeting was to explore ways that the friars might be of assistance to the nuns, as proposed in **Begin Always Anew**, the document from the General Chapter held in Lisieux in 1997. That document has been the basis for meetings throughout the Order of friars and nuns, including this present gathering. The excerpt follows:

5. SERVICE TO OUR DISCALCED CARMELITE SISTERS

- 105.** It was the desire of Holy Mother Teresa that there would exist a unity between friars and nuns in the same family. The changes in society and the Church in relation to women invite us to continue this relationship in a renewed way, by no means any less profound and fraternal because of this. In this regard the following suggestions could be of help:
- a. Aware of the new role of women in society and the Church, to continue our apostolic ministry to the nuns in a spirit of co-responsibility and mutual collaboration, and to encourage the Church's recommendation to form Associations and Federations.
 - b. Encourage a regular relationship between the Centre of the Order and the Assistants to the Federations and Associations.
 - c. Fr. General and the Definitors should continue to visit all the Federations, Associations and groupings of monasteries in as far as possible.
 - d. To take care that our friars are trained to relate with the nuns in the new, less individualistic style, with a respectful approach to their autonomy and a desire for reciprocal help and cooperation.
 - e. Particularly for those who minister to the nuns, to organize meetings and training seminars to reflect on their experience and to help one another.

- f. Remain open at every level so that the nuns can take part in our discussions and, if it be opportune, to invite them to official discussions that concern them in some way or other.
